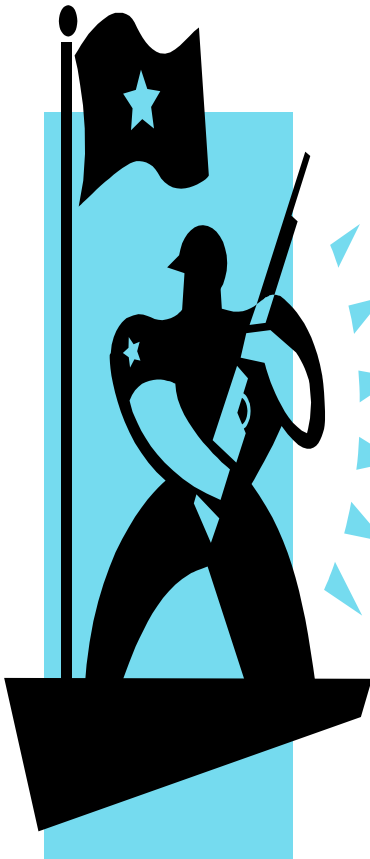


The ASVAB

What is the ASVAB?



The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is a multi-aptitude test battery. It consists of 10 short individual tests covering Word Knowledge, Paragraph Comprehension, Arithmetic Reasoning, Mathematics Knowledge, General Science, Auto and Shop Information, Mechanical Comprehension, Electronics Information, Numerical Operations and Coding Speed. Not only do you receive scores on these individual tests; you also receive composite scores. Composite scores are the results of individual tests combined to yield three academic scores: Verbal, Math, and Academic Ability.

The ASVAB centers on three things:

- ★ Discovering what your interests, abilities, and preferences are
- ★ Matching your interests, abilities, and preferences with occupations
- ★ Learning where and how to get information on different careers

Should I take the ASVAB if I plan to go to college?

Yes. The ASVAB can help you decide which college to attend and what to study. The results provide you with information on your readiness for advanced academic information.
